Specialised trained staff is employed for serving the various types of disabled. There is a specialised teacher for every 8 children as for these children approved ratio is 1:8 for paying personal attention to every child. Number of disabled are being served under the various programmes.

INTRODUCTION :

Association for the Handicapped has completed 27 years of its existence. Services were started in rented accommodation back then. Now it has its own comfortable building for the beneficiaries. Management and staff tries to give their best.

This year was full of events - Competitions, Medical Camps, Picnics, Celebrations etc. Students and staff enjoyed eventful year. It not only boosted their morale but gave them confidence also.

Association always try to mainstream the disabled in the society through education or employment or every which way possible. It also tries to bring colours and happiness in the lives of old age grannies.

All the services are free of cost. No Caste, Colour, Creed, Gender or Religion is considered while rendering the services.

SCHOOL FOR THE HEARING IMPAIRED CHILDREN :

73 Hearing Impaired students received education during the year. 50 of them were boys while 23 were girls. It is a Primary school (upto grade V). It's recognized by Haryana Primary Education Board since 1998. Haryana board's curriculum is being followed in the school.



8 Special Educators are there to provide education to the hearing impaired students. The education is being imparted from Nursery to grade five. Three years of Pre-education is being provided before grade 1st. Primarily Speech and Language is being taught during these three years.

Oral - Aural method is being followed to train hearing impaired students. There is sound treated room available in the school to impart Speech Therapy and to assess the hearing capacity of the students. 'C' shape has been adapted for the class room furniture of our hearing impaired children. In this pattern, students can clearly

1:8 or maximum 1:10 is the ratio in each class room so that special attention can be given to each student. Drawing and Painting, Sports, Dance etc. have been taught in the school beside the education.



School has a Library and well ventilated rooms. Air Coolers, Water Cooler, Generator, Lights, Fans and Separate toilets for both boys and girls. It has a play ground also where students can play outdoor games.

Education is being provided free of cost to the hearing impaired students. Education material, books and uniforms are also free for the hearing impaired students. Behind th Ear (BTE) Hearing Aids have been secured for the students during the year.

Free Medical Camps have been conducted during the year to deworm the students and to get their eyes checked up. Free Spectacles have been given to those students who required them. Another camp had been conducted to get their Blood Group tested.

Parents-Teacher meets have been conducted from time to time. Experts have been invited during regular intervals.

Every year students celebrate World Disabled Day on 3rd of December. This year also it was celebrated by conducting sports competition.



Hearing impaired students have been taken for excursion to Leisure Valley Park. Students celebrated all the major festivals during the year – Republic day, Independence day, Gandhi Jayanti, Diwali, Christmas etc.

Students Participated in various competitions at District and State level such as Drawing and Painting, Dance etc. They won prizes also.

Hearing Impaired students were promoted to the next classes as final exams were not conducted due to Covid-19. They are promoted on the basis of their class room performance and assessment.



Hon'ble Session Judge pay visit once in a month to meet our students.

HOSTEL FOR THE HEARING IMPAIRED STUDENTS :



18 Students derived benefit of this facility during the year. This facility is only for male children. Most of the students are from rural background as they have no access to education at their native place.

Hearing Impaired children visit their families during the vacations and on festivals. They enjoy their stay in the hostel. They leave the hostel after passing grade 5th in the school.

By the time they are prepared to join regular schools in their native place. If they found any difficulty, our school helps them by sending special educator once or twice or as required to adjust the hearing impaired students in that set up.

A Warden, Two Helpers and a Cook are there to take care of the hostlers. Helpers are there to wash their clothes, dishes and clean their rooms. Cook prepare meals for them. Warden take care of their home work, play in the evening and stay.

Hostler students have fixed schedule after school. They relax after school, then they do their home work. In the evening they play outdoor games in the play ground.

Air Coolers, Water Cooler, Fans Lights, Generator are there for their comfortable stay. A dining hall, well ventilated rooms are available. Two Toilets cum bathrooms are there.

Healthy meals are being provided to the hostler students. Their menu is being fixed with the consultation of Dietician and Nutritionist.

This facility is also free of cost. School charges no money for their stay food, education etc.

It is being observed that the academic performance of hostler students is better than the day-scholars. They excel in sports too. Hearing Impaired students enjoy their stay in hostel.

HOME FOR THE SENIOR CITIZENS :



29 Senior Citizens are residing in the home. 18 of them are female while 11 are male. 8 new citizens joined the home while 3 left during the year. Two of them were female and one was male. One male and female went back to their homes while third lady's son came to bring her to their house. One died during the year.

There are 12 well ventilated rooms in the home. There is a medical room, dining hall, kitchen and 6 bathrooms and toilets.

Fans, Tube-lights, Air Cooler, Water Cooler, Generator are available to make the stay comfortable.

All the services provided to the grannies are free of cost – Stay, Food, Clothes, Medicines etc.

Daily News Paper, Holy Scriptures, Television etc. are available for them. A morning assembly is being conducted. Where they perform Yoga, Light Exercises and share their experiences or problems.

A Matron, A Nurse (GNM), Cook, Helper are there to take care of the Senior Citizens. Doctor pay visit twice a week. Psychologist is also there to ease their psychological burdens.

Several health check-up camps have been conducted during the year by several Hospitals :-

- ☞ In the month of May, 2019 by Asian Hospital, Faridabad
- ☞ In the month of August, 2019 by Inner Wheel Club, Faridabad
- ☞ In the month of February, 2020 by Indraprastha Apollo Hospital, Sarita Vihar, New Delhi.

Helpage India visits our grannies every Tuesday. Medicines were also given after the check-up.

Doctor from Escorts Charitable Hospital visits our grannies once in a week and Medicines were also given.

In the month of October, 2019 Red Cross Society also conducted a camp where they provided Cane, Walkers, Spectacles, Hearing Aids, Tri-cycles etc. to those who required.

District Social Welfare Officer, Faridabad Smt. Sushila Devi Honoured Senior Citizens at our Home on 1st October 2019 International Older Persons Day.

Healthy meals are being provided to the grannies. The menu is being fixed after consultation with Nutritionist and Dietician. Milk, Fruits and Seasonal Vegetables are part of their menu. Fancy meals are being prepared on festivals and special occasions.

They are free to visit their relatives or religious places but only on prior information.

Association tries to make the evening of their lives pleasant. Most of the grannies suffer from some ailment or other. Moreover they remain away from their dear ones.

INTEGRATED EDUCATION :

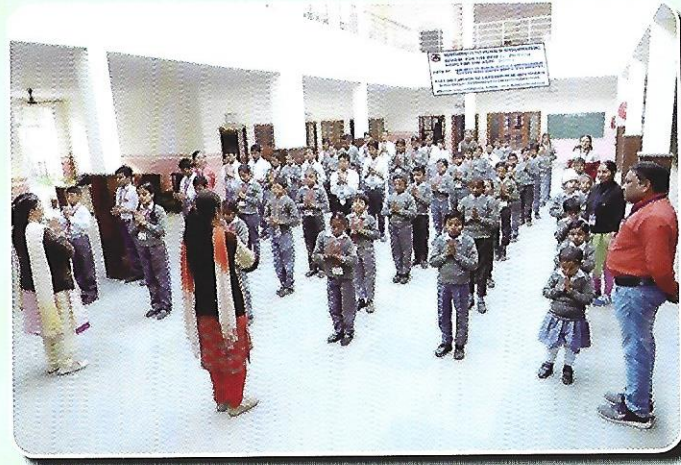
Two special educators have been providing education to disabled students in Jind District of Haryana under IED-SS scheme. 128 number of disabled students are being covered under this scheme.

These 128 disabled students receive education in 63 normal regular schools with the help of two special educators.

Several personalized services are also being provided to disabled such as Wheel Chairs, Hearing Aids, Employment etc.
